## Our Speakers

### SUSAN ROSENBERG, PETCO FOUNDATION

Susan, who has been with Petco for 15 years, is national grants and disaster relief manager for the foundation and, as such, reviews and makes grant decisions and develops disaster relief practices. She works closely with over 8,000 Petco Foundation charitable partners and over 1,200 Petco stores that manage abandoned pets and adoptions. As a regular presenter at animal welfare conferences and workshops, she is the face of the Petco Foundation. In addition to her responsibilities at the foundation, she is a director for several animal welfare organizations in San Diego and works with disaster relief management organizations nationally. She is also an animal handler for the Animal Rescue Reserve.

### MELISSA VECERA, PETFINDER

Melissa is a shelter outreach specialist for Petfinder. She has several years of volunteer experience, including writing press releases and attending meet-and-greet events on behalf of the Mid-Atlantic Great Dane Rescue League, Inc., and hands-on shelter experience at the MDSPCA. She has always loved animals and is continually looking for new ways to help them by spreading the mission of animal welfare. She currently works near Baltimore, MD, and shares her home with a Dachshund named Lily, whom she found on Petfinder.

### EMILY GARMAN, THE SOCIAL ANIMAL.COM

Emily has been a foster mom and animal welfare volunteer for 15 years and founded TheSocialAnimal.com in 2008 to teach animal advocates how to use social media to raise money, recruit volunteers and save more lives. She presents on next-generation fundraising, social media and mega-adoption events all over the world. In 2011 she traveled to Riga, Latvia, to present at the Dogs Trust European Summit and to the US Virgin Islands to consult with individual shelters. She received the 2010 Advocate in action award from the Oklahoma Alliance for Animals for her work in using social media to pass puppy mill legislation in Oklahoma; she helped Texas organizations do the same in 2011.

### STEPHANIE JANEZKO, DVM, MS, DABVP, THE ASPCA

After receiving her DVM from Cornell in 2004, Dr. Janeczko worked in small animal practice with shelters and rescue groups before returning to Cornell as its first shelter medicine resident. She is board certified in canine and feline practice and is a member of the organizing committee for a board specialty in shelter medicine. She is also a certified animal welfare administrator and president of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians. Dr. Janeczko currently works for the ASPCA as senior director of community outreach shelter medicine programs, working locally in NYC as well as nationally to help shelters and animal welfare groups develop and improve their medical programs. She shares her home with her furry family – four wonderful cats and the two best dogs in the world – along with one very understanding husband!

### LEIGH SIEGFRIED, MISSION DOG

Leigh Siegfried is a certified pet dog trainer (CPDT-KA), a shelter veteran and the owner of Opportunity Barks Behavior & Training, serving Greater Philadelphia and Northern Virginia and offering group training classes, private lessons and behavioral help for dogs and their owners. Shelter pros and shelter dogs have a special place in her heart, and she's happy to support those that are in the trenches.
