KAREN MEADER, PETCO

Karen is the national adoption program manager covering the Midwest, Northeast, Mid-Atlantic and Southeast regions for Petco for the past three years. Prior to her current role, she was the regional marketing coordinator for the Southeast and a general manager and operations manager for Petco stores in Florida for a total of 10 years with the company. In addition, she has been able to attend many animal welfare conferences hosted by organizations such as the Society of Animal Welfare Administrators, the Humane Society of the United States, the ASPCA, Best Friends Animal Society and Petfinder. She has also attended an animal control officer certification course and received certification at the end of the course. She currently has five rescue pets -- three cats and two dogs -- and lives on the East Coast of Florida with her husband and son.

MELISSA VECERA, PETFINDER

Melissa is a shelter outreach specialist for Petfinder. She has over seven years of volunteer experience, including writing press releases and attending meet-and-greet events on behalf of the Mid-Atlantic Great Dane Rescue League, Inc., and hands-on shelter experience at the MDSPCA. She currently manages the North American Adoption Options conference series as well as all Petfinder webinars. She works near Baltimore, MD, and shares her home with a Dachshund named Lily, whom she found on Petfinder.

JAN MCHUGH-SMITH, CAWA, HUMANE SOCIETY OF THE PIKES PEAK REGION

Jan McHugh-Smith is the president/CEO of the Humane Society of the Pikes Peak Region, an open-admission organization with two facilities serving 28,000 animals annually throughout Southern Colorado. Jan's animal welfare experience over the past 28 years also includes being president of the San Francisco SPCA, CEO of the Humane Society of Boulder Valley, CO, and director of Eagle County Animal Control, CO. Most importantly, she shares her life with her husband, son and three wonderful shelter dogs, Pepito, Flint and Molly.

STEPHANIE JANECKO, DVM, MS, DABVP, THE ASPCA

After receiving her DVM from Cornell in 2004, Dr. Janeczko worked in small animal practice with shelters and rescue groups before returning to Cornell as its first shelter medicine resident. She is board certified in canine and feline practice and is a member of the organizing committee for a board specialty in shelter medicine. She is also a certified animal welfare administrator and president of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians. Dr. Janeczko currently works for the ASPCA as senior director of community outreach shelter medicine programs, working locally in NYC as well as nationally to help shelters and animal welfare groups develop and improve their medical programs. She shares her home with her furry family -- four wonderful cats and the three best dogs in the world!

JENN BARG, MS, ACAAB, CDBC

Jenn is the shelter manager for Pueblo Animal Services, an open-admission facility in southern Colorado that takes in roughly 7000 animals annually. She has been a student of animal behavior since 1990 with both bachelor's and master's degrees in biology. From 2006 to 2011, she was self-employed as a dog behavior consultant; shelters contracted with her to implement behavior programs and evaluations. From 2002 to 2008, she worked for the Upper Valley Humane Society as the head of behavior and training and as head behavior consultant. She has served the New England Federation of Humane Societies and is currently a board member of the Colorado Federation of Animal Welfare Agencies. Jenn is an associate certified animal behaviorist and also a certified dog behavior consultant.
