Our Speakers

KAREN MEADER, PETCO FOUNDATION

Karen is the national adoption program manager covering the Midwest, Northeast, Mid-Atlantic and Southeast regions for Petco for the past three years. Prior to her current role, she was the regional marketing coordinator for the Southeast and a general manager and operations manager for Petco stores in Florida for a total of 10 years with the company. In addition, she has been able to attend many animal welfare conferences hosted by organizations such as the Society of Animal Welfare Administrators, the Humane Society of the United States, the ASPCA, Best Friends Animal Society and Petfinder. She has also attended an animal control officer certification course and received certification at the end of the course. She currently has five rescue pets – three cats and two dogs – and lives on the east coast of Florida with her husband and son.

KAREN DASHFIELD, DVM, ANTLER RIDGE WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

Dr. Dashfield is a shelter veterinarian with 24 years of experience designing disease control programs for shelters, kennels and wildlife rehabilitators throughout New Jersey. As director of the Sussex County Animal Response Team (CART), she initiated and ran a shelter for Hurricane Katrina Dogs in 2005/2006 that received, re-homed and reunited over 200 animals. As a house-call veterinarian, Dr. Dashfield provides regular consultation with shelter and rescue groups and is the full-time medical director at Antler Ridge Wildlife Sanctuary (www.antler-ridge.com). She prepares future animal control officers, shelter workers, and wildlife rehabilitators through her teaching for Career Development Institute and at local and regional conferences. Karen shares her home with her five dogs, Red, Dusty, Bella, Sadie and Pollywog, and a cat named Princess.

MELISSA VECERA, PETFINDER

Melissa is a shelter outreach specialist for Petfinder. She has over eight years of volunteer experience, including writing press releases and attending meet-and-greet events on behalf of the Mid-Atlantic Great Dane Rescue League, Inc., and hands-on shelter experience at the MDSPCA. Since 2012, in her role as manager of the North American Adoption Options conference series, she has traveled to over 50 different cities to bring the latest animal welfare knowledge to local communities. She works near Baltimore, MD, and shares her home with her Dachshund named Lily and her hedgehog named Olive.

PATTY HEGWOOD, BEST FRIENDS ANIMAL SOCIETY

A New Orleans native, Patty was the lay business partner in a veterinary hospital serving over 22 humane organizations throughout the New Orleans area. She and her veterinary business partner operated a high volume spay/neuter clinic and adoption center and would frequently pull animals from the local animal shelter. When Hurricane Katrina hit, Patty stayed through the storm, emptied her hospital of supplies and, with fellow rescuers, operated on the front lines to save as many animals as they could. This is where Patty met Best Friends and realized they were kindred souls. Patty joined Best Friends in 2006 as the manager of the Best Friends Clinic and, after serving four years as the animal care director, Patty embraced the role of the inaugural director for the newly formed Volunteer and Visitor Experience Division for Best Friends Animal Society. Her division focuses on all of the areas of work with visitors and volunteers, including national events, national programming and the sanctuary based in southern Utah. Volunteers are at the heart of Best Friends success, and building that constituent of enthusiastic and impactful individuals creates many opportunities for people to give their best and join the mission to Save Them All.

JENN BARG, MS, ACAAB, CDBC, DENVER ANIMAL SHELTER

Jenn is the behavior coordinator for the Denver Animal Shelter. She holds a BS and an MS in biology and is an associate certified applied animal behaviorist and certified dog behavior consultant. She has a diverse background in animal welfare that spans 14 years, including serving as the shelter manager for Pueblo Animal Services in Pueblo, CO, head of behavior and training for the Upper Valley Humane Society in New Hampshire, and also ran her own private behavior consultation business. Jenn is also currently a regular speaker for Petfinder's Adoption Options workshops nationwide. In her previous career she was a research scientist studying migratory bird behavioral ecology. Jenn served the New England Federation of Humane Societies board and is currently a board member of Colorado Federation of Animal Welfare Agencies.
