KAREN MEADER, PETCO FOUNDATION

Karen is the national adoption program manager covering the Midwest, Northeast, Mid-Atlantic and Southeast regions for Petco for the past three years. Prior to her current role, she was the regional marketing coordinator for the Southeast and a general manager and operations manager for Petco stores in Florida for seven years. In addition, she has been able to attend many animal welfare conferences hosted by organizations such as the Society of Animal Welfare Administrators, the Humane Society of the United States, the ASPCA, Best Friends Animal Society and Petfinder. She has also attended an animal control officer certification course and received certification at the end of the course. She currently has five rescue pets - three cats and two dogs - and lives on the East Coast of Florida with her husband and son.

STEPHANIE JANECZKO, DVM, MS, DABVP, THE ASPCA

After receiving her DVM from Cornell in 2004, Dr. Janeczko worked in small animal practice with shelters and rescue groups before returning to Cornell as its first shelter medicine resident. She is board certified in canine and feline practice and is a member of the organizing committee for a board specialty in shelter medicine. She is also a certified animal welfare administrator and president of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians. Dr. Janeczko currently works for the ASPCA as senior director of community outreach shelter medicine programs, working locally in New York City as well as nationally to help shelters and animal welfare groups develop and improve their medical programs. She shares her home with her furry family - four wonderful cats and the two best dogs in the world - along with one very understanding husband!

MELISSA VECERA, PETFINDER

Melissa is a shelter outreach specialist for Petfinder. She has over eight years of volunteer experience, including writing press releases and attending meet-and-greet events on behalf of the Mid-Atlantic Great Dane Rescue League, and hands-on shelter experience at the MDSPCA. Since 2012, in her role as manager of the North American Adoption Options conference series, she has traveled to over 50 cities to bring the latest animal welfare knowledge to local communities. She works near Baltimore, MD, and shares her home with her Dachshund named Lily and her Hedgehog named Olive.

LINDA REIDER, MICHIGAN HUMANE SOCIETY

Linda Reider is the director of statewide initiatives for the Michigan Humane Society, which operates three open-admission adoption centers and full-service veterinary centers, one satellite adoption center and three offsite cat centers in the greater Detroit area. She works to better connect animal shelters and rescue groups statewide through the Michigan Partnership for Animal Welfare (MPAW) state federation. Linda travels the state, visiting and advising animal shelters and rescue groups, represents MHS on state-level committees, is a founding board member of the Michigan State Animal Response Team and works on pet-related legislation. Linda holds B.S. and M.S. degrees, plus a certificate in nonprofit business and management, and has held various positions in the animal welfare field for the past 30 years. She lives with her son's two hairy cats.

DAVID MURIELLO, CPDT-KA, CATCH CANINE TRAINERS ACADEMY

David Muriello is the founder and school director of CATCH Canine Trainers Academy, a national school offering state-licensed certification courses in dog training and behavior. In addition to his firsthand experience training thousands of dogs in private lessons, group classes and behavior workshops, David has extensive experience in hiring and teaching dog trainers. After six years as director of training at Biscuits & Bath (eight locations in New York City), David became the director of operations there, expanding his knowledge of dog care services, including day and overnight care, veterinary services, walking, grooming and transportation. David has appeared as a dog expert on ABC-TV's The Rachael Ray Show and the Discovery Channel and is regularly quoted in *Dog Fancy* magazine. When he is not working, his love of the outdoors draws him into long hikes with his Pit Bull/Pointer mix, Hazel, where the two of them love life among the sights and sounds (and scents) of nature.
