Brian DiGangi is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Shelter Medicine at the University of Florida. He became the first shelter medicine resident to graduate from UF and received his MS in Veterinary Medical Sciences in 2010. Dr. DiGangi has published research on feline adoption, pregnancy detection and immunology. He is board certified in both Canine and Feline Practice and Shelter Medicine Practice by the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners. He has been a member of the Board of Directors of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians since 2010, currently serving as President.

COURTNEY CUNNINGHAM

PETCO FOUNDATION

Courtney Cunningham has been the Lifesaving Partner Relations Specialist for the Petco Foundation since February of 2016. She graduated from Stephen F. Austin State University in 2010 and has since been working in the non-profit sector, including work in program and fundraising development. Before joining the animal welfare community, Courtney focused on youth program development, including work for the Girl Scouts of Southwest Texas. Since 2015, she has been working in the animal welfare community, first with a grass roots no-kill shelter on their development and media team, and recently joining the Petco Foundation team. A lifelong shelter animal advocate, Courtney is the proud mother of two rescue cats and one dog.

Emily has been a foster mom and animal welfare volunteer for 15 years and founded TheSocialAnimal.com in 2008 to teach animal advocates how to use social media to raise money, recruit volunteers and save more lives. She presents on next-generation fundraising, social media and mega-adoption events all over the world. In 2011 she traveled to Riga, Latvia, to present at the Dogs Trust European Summit and to the US Virgin Islands to consult with individual shelters. She received the 2010 Advocate in action award from the Oklahoma Alliance for Animals for her work in using social media to pass puppy mill legislation in Oklahoma; she helped Texas organizations do the same in 2011.

Jenn Barg is the Behavior Coordinator for the Denver Animal Shelter. She holds a BS and MS in Biology and is an Associate Certified Applied Animal Behaviorist and Certified Dog Behavior Consultant. She has a diverse background in animal welfare that spans 14 years including serving as the Shelter Manager for Pueblo Animal Services in Pueblo, CO, Head of Behavior and Training for the Upper Valley Humane Society in New Hampshire, and also ran her own private behavior consultation business. Jenn is also currently a regular speaker for Petfinder's Adoption Options workshops nationwide. In her previous career she was a research scientist studying migratory bird behavioral ecology. Jenn served the New England Federation of Humane Societies board and is currently a board member of Colorado Federation of Animal Welfare Agencies.
